MICHAEL GILDAY**  
32nd Chief of Naval Operations

Admiral Mike Gilday began serving as the 32nd Chief of Naval Operations on August 22, 2019.

At sea, he deployed with USS Chandler (DDG 996), USS Princeton (CG 59), and USS Gettysburg (CG 64). He commanded destroyers USS Higgins (DDG 76) and USS Benfold (DDG 65) and subsequently, commanded Destroyer Squadron 7, serving as sea combat commander for the Ronald Reagan Carrier Strike Group. As a flag officer, he served as commander Carrier Strike Group 8 embarked aboard USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN 69), and as commander, U.S. Fleet Cyber Command and U.S. 10th Fleet. His staff assignments include the Bureau of Naval Personnel; staff of the Chief of Naval Operations, and staff of the Vice Chief of Naval Operations. Joint assignments include executive assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and naval aide to the President.

As a flag officer, he served in joint positions as director of operations for NATO's Joint Force Command Lisbon; as chief of staff for Naval Striking and Support Forces NATO; director of operations, J3, for U.S. Cyber Command; and as director of operations, J3, for the Joint Staff. He recently served as director, Joint Staff.

Fmr Director of National  
Intelligence; Fmr Commander in  
Chief, U.S. Pacific Command

Admiral Dennis Blair is the first Knott Distinguished Visiting Professor of the Practice at the University of North Carolina Chapel Hill. He serves as a member of the Energy Security Leadership Council and chairs the board of Securing America's Future Energy. In addition, he serves on the boards of Freedom House, the National Bureau of Asian Research, the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, No Labels, and chairs the Strategic Advisory Group of Lockheed Martin Space.

From 2014-2018 Admiral Blair was the CEO and Chairman of the Board of the Sasakawa Peace Foundation USA. From January 2009 to May 2010, as Director of National Intelligence, Admiral Blair led the sixteen national intelligence agencies. He was president and chief executive officer of the Institute for Defense Analyses from 2003-2006.

Prior to retiring from the Navy in 2002 after a career of 34 years, Admiral Blair was the Commander in Chief, U.S. Pacific Command.

Rozlyn (Roz) C. Engel is Chief Economic Strategist at the MITRE Corporation, a nonprofit corporation that has worked in the public interest for more than six decades. Prior to joining MITRE, Roz spent nearly 20 years at the nexus of economics, national security, and U.S. policy development. From 2019 to 2021, Roz was a Distinguished Professor of the Practice at the U.S. Naval Academy. From 2016 to 2018, she was the senior career executive in charge of U.S. macroeconomic analysis. From January 2017 onward, she also fulfilled the duties of the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Macroeconomic Policy. From 2013 to 2016, Roz was the National Intelligence Manager and National Intelligence Officer for Economics in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, where she oversaw all global economic analysis in support of U.S. national security priorities and worked closely with the National Security Council and major economic policy agencies.

Former Commanding General of  
the U.S. Army, Europe

Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Mark Hertling served for 38 years in the U.S. Army as a tanker and cavalryman, serving at every level from tank platoon leader on the East-West German border to Commander of the 7th Army. He retired in December 2012, after serving as the Commanding General of U.S. Army, Europe (USAREUR), where he led over 60,000 soldiers and partnered with the Armies of 51 nations.

After retiring from the Army, LTG Hertling became a Senior Vice President for a major healthcare organization in Orlando, retiring from that organization in 2018. He was appointed to the President's Council on Fitness, Sport and Nutrition by President in 2014, and in 2021 he was appointed by President Biden to be a commissioner of the American Battle Monuments Commission, where he now serves as Chairman. Mark was an adjunct scholar at West Point's Modern War Institute from 2014-2020, and he actively teaches as an adjunct professor of strategic leadership at the Crummer School of Business at Rollins College.

Intelligence Officer

Arthur House is an Adjunct Professor at the University of Connecticut and former Cybersecurity Policy Advisor to Connecticut's Secretary of the State. He became Chief Cybersecurity Risk Officer for the State of Connecticut in October 2016 after four years as Chairman of Connecticut's Public Utilities Regulatory Authority.

House has a background in national security, having served as Director of Communications in the Office of the Director of National Intelligence and as Chief of the Communications Group for the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency, a combat support agency of the U.S. Department of Defense. As a White House Fellow he served as Special Projects Officer on the staff of the National Security Council.

He worked in Asia and Africa as an economist and loan officer for the World Bank and was a Congressional Adviser to the United States Mission to the United Nations. In the private sector, House was Senior Vice President of Public Affairs at Webster Bank and also held senior executive positions at Cigna, Aetna, and Tenneco.

Luke Knittig is Power Africa's new Washington-based communications specialist. He joins USAID from ASU's McCain Institute for International Leadership, where he led communications and hosted a popular podcast. Before that, he was VP of communications for LMI, proudly supporting USAID and more than 40 government agencies and activities.

Finishing his military career at the Pentagon, Luke led high-visibility initiatives as senior advisor to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Public Affairs. There he also served as special assistant to the Army's vice chief of staff, and as public affairs officer for the undersecretary. Luke deployed to Afghanistan as principal military spokesman and press center director in 2006 for NATO mission expansion of the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF).

A combat veteran, his early assignments included the First Armored Division, where he achieved Distinguished Leader honors, and with the Third Infantry Division, where he earned Top Engineer Company Commander distinction.



**FAWZIA KOOFI**  
Fmr Second Deputy  
Speaker, Afghan Parliament

Fawzia Koofi was a member of peace negotiation team representing Islamic Republic of Afghanistan. She decided to run for a seat in parliament from the Badakhshan province, she was elected Member of Parliament from that province in September 2005. Fawzia was elected as the first woman Second Deputy Speaker of Parliament in the history of Afghanistan, in 2010 she ran and won for second time. She chaired parliament standing committee on women and human rights from 2010- 2019. She was the member of and president of IPU's committee on Human rights of parliamentarians from 2016-2019.

Soon after completing her baccalaureate degree, the Taliban took over in September 1995, and barred women from access to all education. Finding the doors of further education closed to her, Fawzia focused her energy on women's right organizations, and worked closely with some of the most vulnerable groups such as Internally Displaced People (IDP), and marginalized women and children. She continued working with UNICEF Afghanistan on women and children's rights especially back to school, Reintegration of Child soldiers and Child trafficking.

In a 38-year reporting career for The New York Times, he has been on three teams that have won Pulitzer Prizes, most recently in 2017 for international reporting. His newest book, "The Perfect Weapon: War, Sabotage and Fear in the Cyber Age," and an HBO documentary by the same title, examine the emergence of cyberconflict and its role in changing the nature of global power.

He is also the author of two Times best sellers on foreign policy and national security: "The Inheritance: The World Obama Confronts and the Challenges to American Power," published in 2009, and "Confront and Conceal: Obama's Secret Wars and Surprising Use of American Power," published in 2012. For The Times, Mr. Sanger has served as Tokyo bureau chief, Washington economic correspondent, White House correspondent during the Clinton and Bush administrations, and chief Washington correspondent.

In these roles, he was the deputy to the air component commander and area air defense commander within the largest and most critical geographic theater.

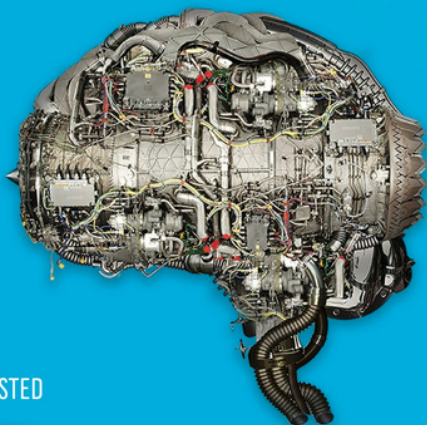
